

The above noted building permit application was issued the attached denial letter on February 5, 2018 and was referred to the Planning and Zoning Boards for a change of use and insufficient on-site parking for its patrons. In addition, the application was referred to the Board of Trustees for the modifications to the public parking on John Street since it proposed to modify the street parking due to the creation of a curb cut and generate one off-street parking space.

The same plan submitted to the Board of Trustees on March 6, 2018 requires realignment of the parking stalls on the west side of John Street and results in the creation of one compact parking space which is not acceptable. The applicant will be requested to modify the plans to comply with the minimum 18 feet deep parking stall and provide sufficient proof that a fire truck can negotiate a left turn on John Street, prior to this department submitting an opinion on this matter.


March 21, 2018

In response to the comments noted above a revised plan was submitted on March 21, 2018. The plan proposes to maintain the first parking stall on John Street and reduce the length of the remaining stalls to 19 feet to achieve the curb cut. The applicant cannot demonstrate the ability for Truck Ladder 78 to maneuver on to John Street or provide for other improvements to the parking situation on John St.

Should the Board want to consider this application further, I have prepared an alternate scenario that is shown on the attached plan that provides a smaller curb cut for dumpster removal and provides additional turning clearances on John St. The plan proposes to shift stalls 1 through 4 five feet from the existing crosswalk, and while this does not meet the minimum 20 feet standard distance from a crosswalk it improves the intersection while maintaining the same number of parking spaces. However, this plan does not allow for a new onsite parking space to be constructed.

Chapter 215. Noise section (215-2H Commercial Equipment-Snow Plow)

Chapter 215. Noise

§ 215-2. Unlawful acts.

[Amended 8-16-1993 by L.L. No. 6-1993]

It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue or cause to be made or continued any of the following acts producing audible sound which are hereby declared to be loud, disturbing and unnecessary noise in violation of this chapter. The unnecessary noises listed below shall not be subject to the maximum sound pressure levels included in § 215-3 hereinbelow, nor shall these acts be considered an exhaustive list, but the occurrence thereof shall be considered a violation of this chapter.

Currently section (H.) of Village Code 215-2 reads as follows:

Н,

Commercial equipment: the operation of any machinery, commercial motor vehicle, truck refrigeration unit, generator, equipment, pump, exhaust fan, attic fan, air-conditioning apparatus or snow plow, in such a manner as to annoy person(s) in any dwelling after the hours of 9:00 p.m. and before the hour of 8:00 a.m. on any weekday and before 10:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m. Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays. Municipal vehicles shall be exempt from this section.

[Added 6-22-1998 by L.L. No. 7-1998]

The proposed addition to the section (H.) of the code would read as follows:

(Addition in yellow highlighted bold underlined print)

H. Commercial equipment: the operation of any machinery, commercial motor vehicle, truck refrigeration unit, generator, equipment, pump, exhaust fan, attic fan, air-conditioning apparatus or snow plow, in such a manner as to annoy person(s) in any dwelling after the hours of 9:00 p.m. and before the hour of 8:00 a.m. on any weekday and before 10:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m. Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays. During the period of a village declared snow emergency, snow plows shall be exempt from this section. Municipal vehicles shall be exempt from this section at all times.

The reason for this proposed change would be to allow for more effective cleanup of lots during heavy periods of snowfall. With significant snowfalls, like the one we just experienced, periodic plowing of the lots was a necessity to reduce the hazards created to the public. Heavy volumes of snowfall often require the removal of snow from the site more than one time. This change would allow better control of cleaning the lots and safer conditions for the general public..

Project Description

The Village of Tarrytown is performing a number of capital improvements in Losee Park, Tarrytown, including installing a new section of the Hudson RiverWalk linkage, and replacing the ballfield lights in Losee Field with the assistance of a \$300,000 grant from the New NYBridge Community Benefit Fund. During our field inspections of the site, it came to our attention that the condition of the bulkhead on the southwest corner of Losee Park is in severely deteriorated condition right where a new overlook plaza is planned as part of the RiverWalk. This is also a short distance away from the Village's Kayak Launch on the Hudson. The approximate length of the RiverWalk that is in need of repair or replacement due to rusting, spalling and steel section loss is approximately 250 to 260 linear feet. The Village has retained the engineering services of McLaren Engineers to work on an expedited design, permitting and construction to get this work done.

Because of the other construction taking place in the park, it is urgent to replace the rusting and rotting bulkhead with either new bulkhead or new rock or concrete-slab shoreline protection, in order to protect the capital investments being made to the park.

The estimated costs to replace the bulkhead with new bulkhead is estimated at approximately \$650,000. The estimate to replace the bulkhead with a new heavy slab rip-rap shoreline may be lower, to the tune of approximately \$500,000. The Village is requesting a grant of \$300,000 from the New NYBridge Fund, with all funds above that funded by the Village of Tarrytown.

Project Benefits

Losee Park is a key park in Tarrytown that is undergoing major renovations and improvements. These include the installation of a portion of the Hudson RiverWalk along Losee Field (estimated to cost between \$500,000 and \$700,000, depending on alternatives and materials, with funding in part from a Westchester County grant, and the major improvements and full replacement of the outdated Losee Field ballfield lights (estimated to cost approximately \$650,000) funded by a \$300,000 grant from the New NYBridge Community Benefit Fund.

It is key at this point to replace the deteriorating and failing southwest corner of bulkhead to protect these new capital investments, prevent any further deterioration of the park, and prevent erosion and sediment from being washed into the Hudson River.

The Village is seeking to implement the most cost effective, durable and longest-lasting solution.

Statement of Need | The Village of Tarrytown Is a community in the immediate vicinity of the New NYBridge. Losee Park is a park along the Hudson River and is viewable both to and from the Mario Cuomo Tappan Zee Bridge. The Village is investing, with help from Westchester County and New York State, hundreds of thousands of dollars in improving the park to make it nicer for visitors, pedestrians, bicyclists and recreational sports participants. The urgent need at this time is to stabilize the waterfront protection, either through bulkhead or rock rip rap shoreline amoring, to prevent damage to the capital improvements that are presently under way.

> As noted previously, due to the many demands on the Village of Tarrytown budget to Improve, maintain or replace portions and sections of our infrastructure, the Village's current debt is equivalent to approximately twice the amount of our annual Village operating budget. The assistance of the Community Benefit Fund is crucial to making this project a reality.

Project Description OCA Crosswalks and Connections Project

The Village of Tarrytown in conjunction with the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (Parks) and the Sleepy Hollow - Tarrytown Trails Committee (the Committee), want to improve the safety and convenience of users (and potential users) of the Old Croton Aqueduct State Historic Park (OCA) trail. To this end, we are proposing the OCA Crosswalks and Connections Project. The project will have the Village and Parks collaborate on designing and implementing several related safety, access and signage improvements on the route of the OCA through more developed areas of the two villages. This includes major barrier areas like the Route 119/I-287 intersection as well as specific local encroachments and disruptions to the trail and user-experience. The successful implementation of this project will improve conditions and navigation of this important regional trail asset, particularly where it will soon connect to the new shared-use path of the bridge.

Maximum characters allowed is 2,000.

Project Benefits This project will enhance transportation and recreational opportunities for local residents and the region as a whole. These benefits will be extended by connections from the OCA to the new bridge's Shared Use Path (SUP) The OCA will connect with the Route 9 Active Transportation Conceptual Design Plan and the Route 119 Complete Street Design Plan, along which are anticipated improvements to pedestrian and bicycle use. The Empire State Trall system, composed of the North- and South- County Trallways in this area, is nearby as well. Of the planned trails and improvements, the Old Croton Aqueduct is the most ready to serve as an east-west connection point between the North-South County Trailways (also designated route of the Empire State Trail) and the new bridge via the Kensico-Tarrytown Lakes Trail.

Statement of Need

Maximum characters allowed is 2,000.

People traversing the OCA in Tarrytown face a slew of difficulties. Though the right-of-way of the Park is nominally 66 feet wide, and the navigable width is usually at least 20 feet wide, there are sections where this is narrowed often to just inches in some places due to encroachments or poor maintenance of invasive or overhanging foliage. A number of sections of the trail have become dangerously uneven due to erosion, exposure of sharp stones and muddy or slippery terrain, which has created tripping hazards. Incomplete incorporation of the OCA into street and sidewalk crossings has created further hazards and even spots where the well-designed curb cuts do not align with the actual trail. Street markings are absent or nearly so, leading to cars parking across and blocking the OCA RoW. There are also places where the OCA deviates from a continuous path, and lack of signage leaves new users without guidance. While each of these inconveniences is minor, taken as a whole, they significantly limit the park's use. Fortunately, they're easy to remedy with wayfinding signs, crosswalks, curb cuts, adjusting car parking spaces, shrub removal and grading.

Note that some encroachments are due to intentional actions by adjacent property owners, and the project does not anticipate trying to regain full access to the right of way beyond what is needed to provide convenient and safe transit for pedestrians and bicyclists.

Chapter 291 (Vehicles and Traffic), specifically Parking section (291-77

Schedule XII: Parking Prohibited at All Times)

Chapter 291. Vehicles and Traffic

§ 291-16 Parking prohibited at all times.

- A. Parking prohibited at all times. No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule XII (§ 291-77), attached to and made a part of this chapter.
- **B.** Special parking regulations.
 - (1) No person shall park or stand any vehicle on the east side of North Broadway from the driveway of 50 North Broadway southerly for a distance of 45 feet, except for the purpose of dropping mail into the outside mailboxes at that location. A violation of this § 291-16B(1) shall be punishable by a fine of \$50. [Amended 10-20-1997]

<u>Currently section 291-77 of the Village Code restricts parking on Meadow Street as follows:</u>

§ 291-77 Schedule XII: Parking Prohibited at All Times.

In accordance with the provisions of § 291-16, no person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the following described streets or parts of streets:







ON APRIL 1ST WHEN THE NYS BUDGET IS APPROVED, WE DESPERATELY NEED YOU TO INCLUDE IN THE NYS BUDGET FUNDING FOR ROAD REPAVING ON NYS ROADS. THERE ARE NUMEROUS POTHOLES, CRATERS ON STATE ROADS WITHIN GREENBURGH. LAST TIME A NYS ROAD WAS REPAVED IN GREENBURGH WAS THREE YEARS AGO. NYS MUST ADDRESS YOUR OWN INFRASTRUCTURE

Honorable Governor and Lawmakers:

Earlier this year I testified before the Westchester delegation to the NYS Assembly and called on the Legislature to appropriate more funding to repave NYS roads within Greenburgh. There are numerous potholes, craters, bumps and cracks on NYS owned roads - including Dobbs Ferry Road 100B, Grasslands Road 100C, 9A Saw Mill River Road, Route 119, and on Central Ave.

I frequently have contacted the NYS Department of Transportation to complain about these infrastructure problems. Potholes are repaired - and then within days turn up again. The last time a NYS road was repaved in Greenburgh was more than three years ago. The conditions on some of these NYS Roads is horrible. I feel we're driving on roads in a 3rd world country, not in Westchester County.

Although I would hope that when the NYS budget is approved on April 1st that there will be more funding for local governments to repave local roads - at the minimum I think that significant funding should be approved so you can address road repaving on roads owned and maintained by NYS. Please give this your highest priority attention.
